#### **Reminders & Notices**

Leave in term time -

In line with our school policy, Langley School follow the Birmingham City Council Leave in Term Time Legal Process.

If a parent/carer considers they require their child to have a leave of absence they should complete the absence request form which can be obtained from the school office. There is a requirement that parent/carers provide evidence of the exceptional circumstances regarding the need for leave for the Head Teacher to consider.

Where requests for leave have not been authorised by the Head Teacher but leave is still taken, Langley School are required to follow the Leave in Term Time Process and refer families to the Education Legal Intervention Team (ELIT). So far this year, 6 families have been referred and penalty notices have been issued to each parent.



We have had a fabulous year; we hope our leavers have a smooth transition into Year 7.


