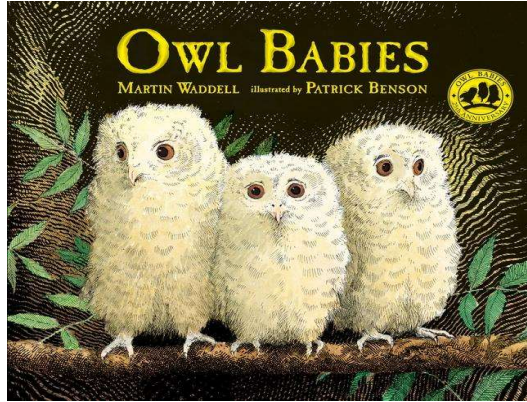

## Geography

In geography, we will take part in a whole school Saints Day. This will provide an opportunity for children to explore and find out about the four countries of the UK and their patron saints through immersive, sensory and creative experiences.

## Science

- Sequence the lifecycle of a tomato plant
- Understand what a plant needs to grow  
Plant a tomato seed
- Begin to understand how to care for the plant

## Art and Design

- To explore malleable materials and use tools to create shapes and textures.
- To plan and create a sculpture using clay.
