

## Langley 'headlines'

### Since the last inspection...

Numbers have increased from 95 pupils to 121 which reflects a commitment to work with the Local Authority to provide for pupils with SEN in Birmingham. There were previously 8 classes – 2 x Foundation, 2 x KS1, 2 x Y3/4 and 2 x Y5/6. There are now 4 x Y5/6 classes (which also accommodate a few Y4 pupils).

A target from the last inspection was to consider feedback to pupils. This has been considered, written strategies modified and credit given to other forms of feedback (eg verbal).

### Developments since 2012 which have enhanced provision

Leadership and management:

- Hard federation with Langley School established and positively impacting across both schools
- Formulation of the five year vision across the federation (we're in the second year now)
- 2013 – Langley became a founding member of the LTE (Learning Trust for Excellence, the first co-operative trust in Birmingham).

Personal development, behaviour and welfare:

- Section 175 safeguarding audits and resulting action plans completed
- My Concern online safeguarding reporting system implemented in Sept 16

Quality of teaching, learning and assessment and outcomes:

- Provision of occupational therapy
- Speech and language therapy provision creatively maintain amidst cut-backs
- National curriculum 2014 embedded
- Forest schools developed
- Work with the Communication Autism Team (from Sept 16)

### Pupil Premium

This is used for:

- Senior learning mentor (family/parent support)
- Intervention Team
- Additional lunchtime support

There are no gaps in attainment between pupils who are in receipt of Pupil Premium and those who are not.

### Sports Premium

Prior to this year, external providers came into school to upskill staff in the teaching and delivery of PE. When considering the impact of this, an agreement was reached that more sustainable methods of development would be considered. Swimming lessons remain a prime focus.
