<u>Attendance</u>

All leave of absence requests will be unauthorised unless the circumstances are exceptional. A parent/carer should complete an absence request form which can be obtained from the school office and submit this to the school at least two weeks prior to the date required. School will respond to the request within two weeks.

Langley School will follow the 'Term Time Leave Guidance for Schools and Academies' (September 2021) and implement the Birmingham City Council Leave in Term Time Legal Process (September 2022) which could result in a referral being made immediately to the Education Legal Intervention Team (ELIT) for consideration. 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Firs Class

Acers have been really busy working hard, we have been learning to count in 2's and 10's and then using that knowledge to multiply! In English we have been learning our phonics sounds and putting that into practise by reading new books. We have also made kites, learnt about sequencing and played team games in PE. We are all now ready for our upcoming break!





Art Club

For the next few weeks in Art Club we are looking at self portraits. Each week we are looking at a different medium to create a portrait. This week we used paint.

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Maples Class

Maples have really enjoyed our topic this half term of Eco-Warriers. We have used the story 'The Under the Sea Cleaning Spree'. We used our story to look at the animals that live in the sea, how we can help them by not leaving our rubbish at the beach and by looking at what we can recycle in class. The children used this story in their reading, writing and topic lessons. The children are looking forward to starting swimming!

Poplars Class

We have had a great half term in Poplars! In English we have been exploring Narnia, rewriting Lucy's entrance into the magical winter wonderland! We've loved learning about King Charles III's Coronation, we made our own party food as well as writing a fact file about the new King. In DT, we have enjoyed designing and making a diamond kite! We have been busy -Well Done Poplars!



Cedars Class

This month Cedars have been looking at healthy eating. We tasted lots of exotic and interesting fruits, they were delicious!

We have also been enjoying forest school sessions. As they're coming to an end we celebrated by building a fire and making rainbow toast!

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Larches Class

What a fabulous half-term we've had in Larches. The children have really enjoyed learning about King Charles III's coronation. In particular, they enjoyed learning about wheels and axles in DT which we then applied to our own royal carriages. We designed, made and decorated them – we think they would be fit for the King! The children have also loved going swimming this half-term and have all gained so much confidence in the water. Well done everyone!

Rowans Class

Rowans have had lots of fun this half term. We have been learning about the Kings Coronation and we had a celebratory picnic on the small playground with our neighbouring class, Willows. We loved dressing up as Royals for the day and enjoyed baking cupcakes in Cooking.

For the remainder of the term, we have been learning about the weather. We have made some beautiful wind chimes in art! We have also enjoyed going to the park every Wednesday afternoon where we learn road safety, map skills, turn-taking, and work on our communication targets.




Willows Class
