## Science

Understand that light can't pass through solid objects, which is why shadows form.

Know that shadows have the same shape as the object because light doesn't bend around it.

Know that light moves in straight lines and doesn't bend around objects.

Understand that light travels from a source, hits an object, and then travels to our eyes.

Understand that some things give off their own light (like the Sun or torches), and others reflect light (like a mirror).
